#### MARILYN DIANN DAVIS










JAMES ALLEN FINE JR.

a veterinarian.








DONNA LISA HOFFMAN











PATRICIA DIANNE MCWRIGHT

### SANDY KAY PUGH






DAVID ROBERT RATHBUN







JUDITH ANN TRUITT




BRENDA SUE WAGNER


### DUANE EARL WEARNER
