And so the dream began . . .

As thirty eight-year-old (1) CHARLES ZIRKLE lay dying from tuberculosis, he and his wife Myra had asked his parents, (2) JOHN AND ELIZABETH ZIRKLE, for his inheritance before he died—a portion of the family farm on which to build an Adventist academy. On Friday, March 24, 1905, Charles' parents staked off 42 acres for a school. Three days later he died assured that the first step in his dream had come true—land on which to build a school.

In the summer of 1908 the Virginia Conference built a (3) SINGLE BUILDING at a cost of \$6000. On the top floor there were five rooms for boys on one end and five rooms for girls on the other end. The principal and his wife had two rooms in the center. On the main floor there was a (4) CHAPEL, two classrooms, an office, a room for the cook, and two bathrooms. The lower level contained a kitchen and a dining room.

The school began as a ten-grade junior academy with (5) 15 STUDENTS divided between the academy and elementary school. In 1911 the (7) FIRST STUDENTS GRADUATED. In 1913 a furnace fire caused the school to shut down for lack of funds to repair it. The Conference decided to move the school to a

place near Richmond where there might be more students, but local church members strongly objected.

Providentially, in 1914 (8) W. C. MOFFETT became Virginia Conference president. When as a youth he became an Adventist, he was evicted from his home. At that time Charles Zirkle, then Atlantic Conference treasurer in Baltimore, had taken him in. Moffett felt that in God's providence he had arrived to return the favor and keep the school where Charles had wanted it. Moffett sponsored evangelistic meetings, fostered elementary schools, and in 1916 called (9) H. M. FORSHEE, a highly qualified principal. As a result, so many students came that they had to build a (11) BOYS DORMITORY and an (12) ADMINISTRATION BUILDING to accommodate them. Through the years since God has blessed SVA through its various crises and kept the school open.

SALT Leadership Retreat

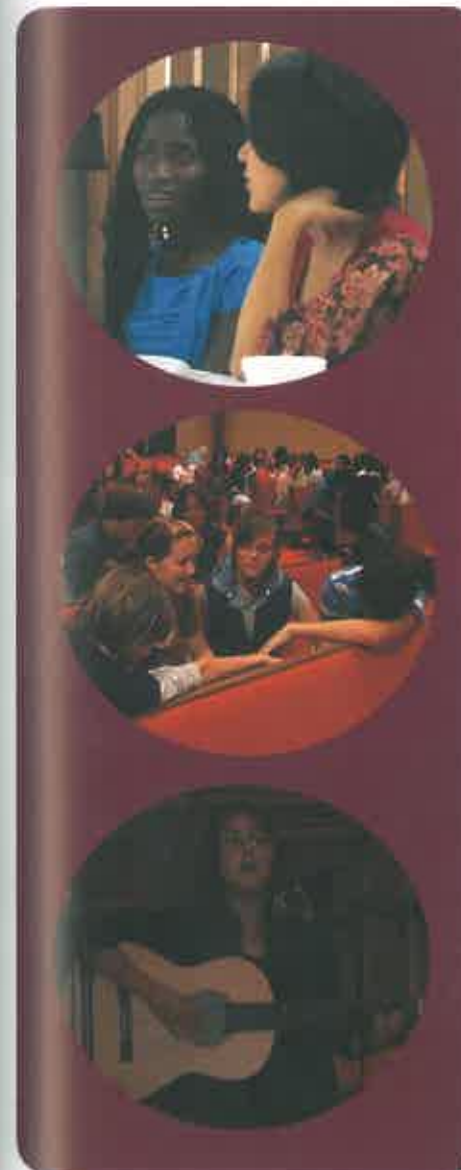
