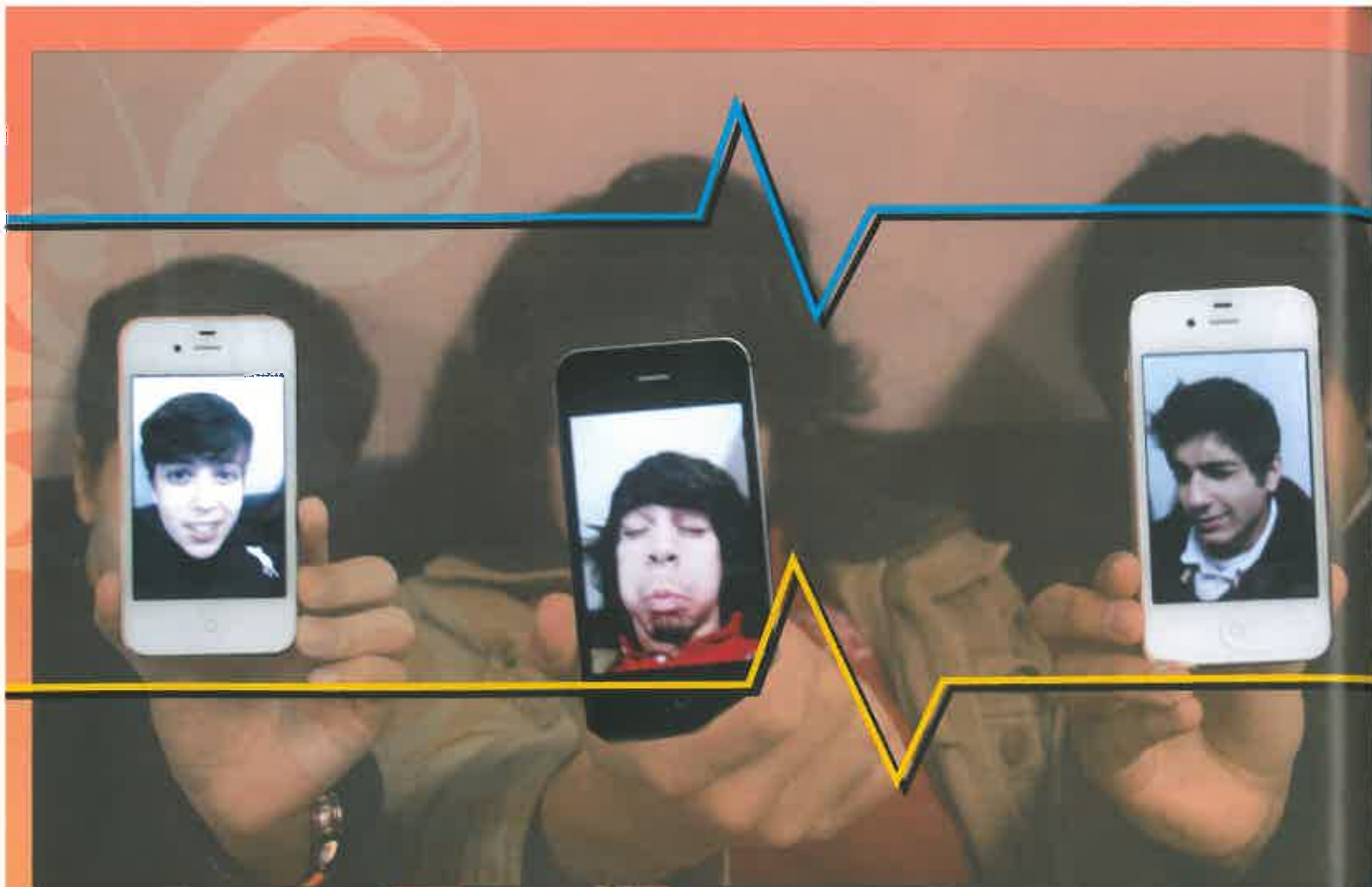
Mrs. Clouzet

Ten students and four sponsors from Shenandoah Valley Academy traveled to Germany and Austria over spring break. They were involved in a unique outreach trip with a mission to meet people in the cities as well as Adventist young people. The first outreach appointment was with the students of PLANT Academy, an outreach training program based at Seminar Schloss Bogenhofen. Bogenhofen is an Adventist Academy and Seminary in Austria. With the help of PLANT students, the students and sponsors went to several neighborhoods in the town of Brauna, and conducted religious surveys and passed out literature. 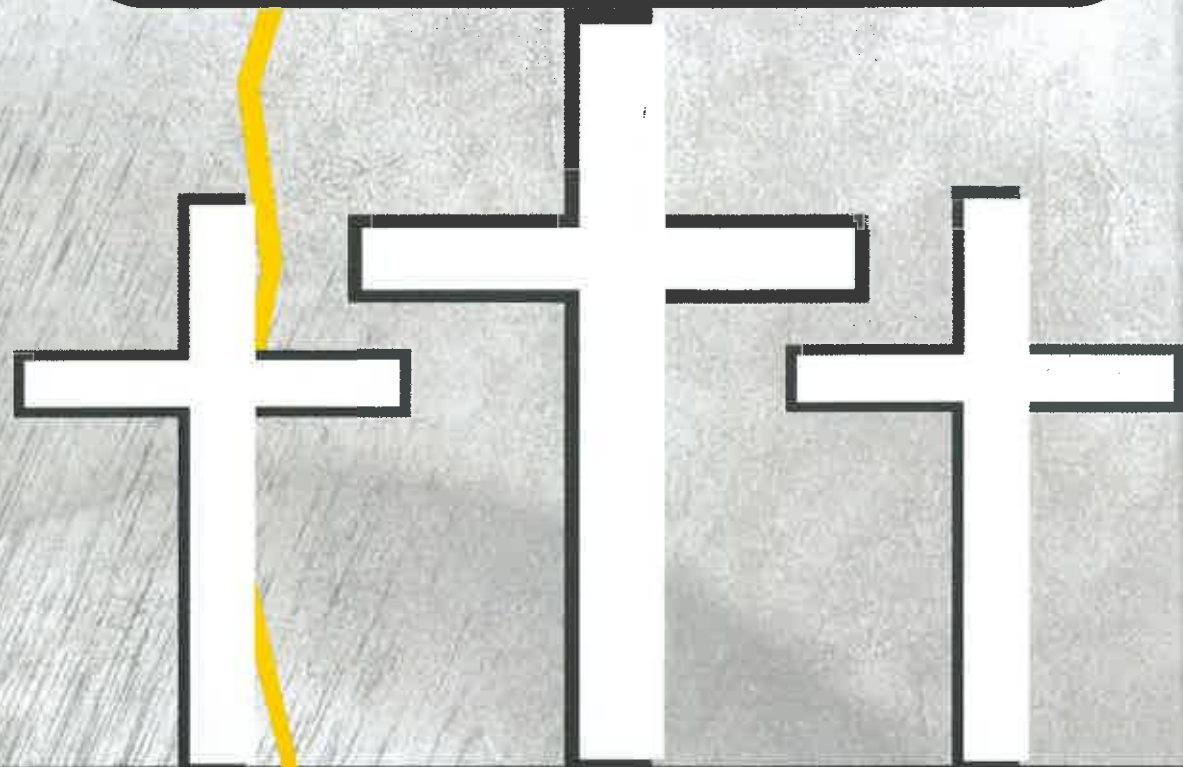

Arriving in the Masai Mara, Africa Mission Services (AMS) housed the SVA students in little huts for the remainder of the two weeks. The students observed the wildlife running around, from zebras grazing near their huts to giraffes strolling around camp. These SVA students had no idea what was in store for them. Many students worked at the AMS school, where daily VBS was held. Some students such as Ashley Rich, Diamond Bell, and Natalie Herrera had the opportunity to work at the delivery ward at the small AMS medical clinic (these girls had the experience of delivering babies!). Natalie commented, "It was really beautiful, a once in a lifetime experience." At the AMS school, students helped complete a boarding house for girls and build a kindergarden room. By the end of the two weeks, both projects were completely finished. Before the students began their work day, they would have a daily morning worship asking God to bless and protect them from any harm; miraculously no student got seriously injured or sick. As the trip began to come to a close, many of the students found it very hard to leave their new African friends and animals they had befriended. The two weeks went by so fast and before they knew it, the students were on the road back to America. These 25 students realized that they transformed their character; many students found themselves humble, meek, and had developed a stronger faith in God. One student, Janelle Tacaca, attests to "feeling like I had just opened my eyes to a world I had completely ignored and I can never shut them out again." Traveling back to America, the students had the opportunity to tour Amsterdam, Holland for several hours. Still jetlagged from their journey, the students eagerly set out in the city and became authentic tourists. Many students spent the remainder of their money at the candy and souvenir shops.

Eventually, all 25 students made it back to America safe and sound.

Shenandoah Valley Academy developed the Washington DC Homeless Ministry over 14 years ago as a part of Campus Ministries outreach. The ministry began with simply feeding homeless people on the streets of our nation's capital and has grown to include clothing, personal care items, literature, and friendships. The food is supplied by the SVA cafeteria, the clothing by the New Market SDA Community Services, and the personal care items by SVA Campus Ministries Department.

The ministry is held at least 7 times during the school year and involves a variety of activity. There is always a bus load of around 45 students who help to set up tables and prepare the food to be served. Students set out the clothing and help the people to find things that they need, hand out personal care items and trash bags to put their things in, and literature to read.

The homeless people always recognize the bus from a distance and come running because they really appreciate receiving the things they desperately need. They are very thankful and many of them praise the students for their involvement. They love talking to the students about staying away from drugs and gangs, and there are many conversations involving faith in God and Jesus Christ.

The Christmas trip always brings out the most people who get the word on the street that SVA is coming. Students personally give the wrapped gifts, watch the smiles and get a hug. 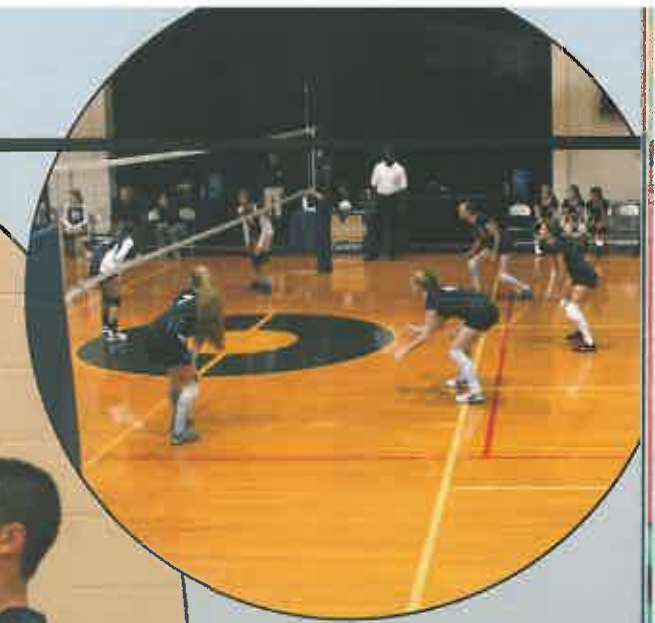

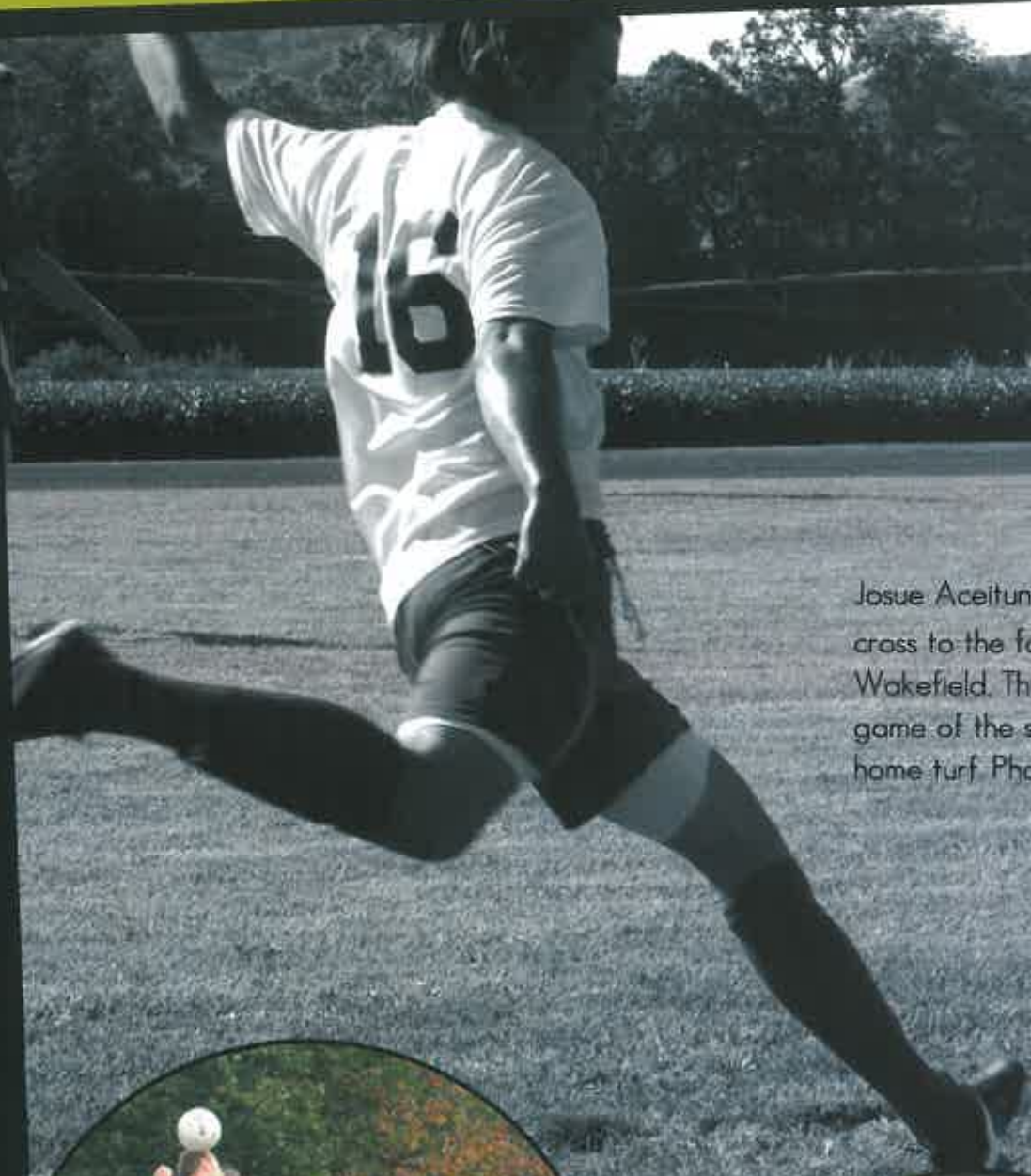
