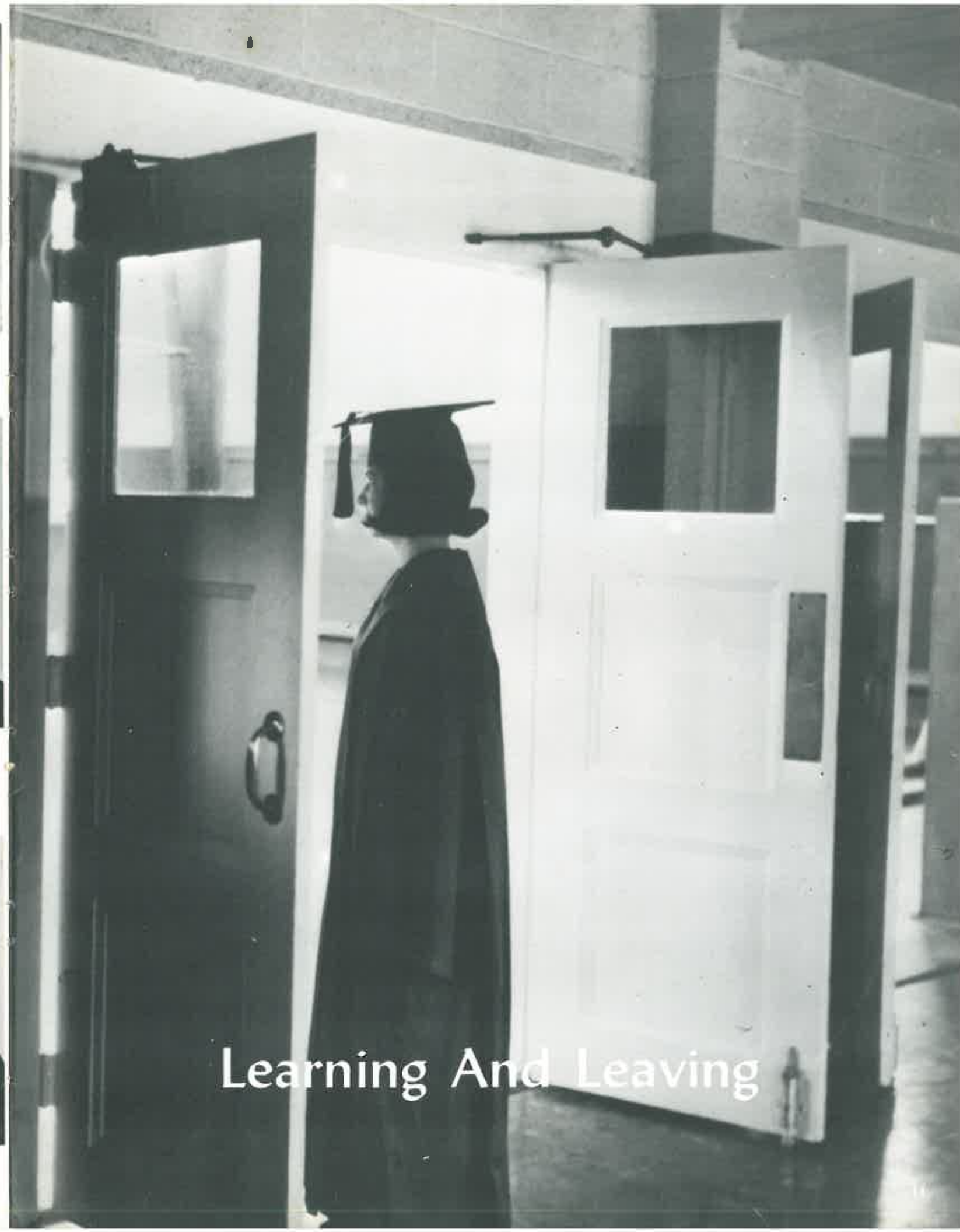

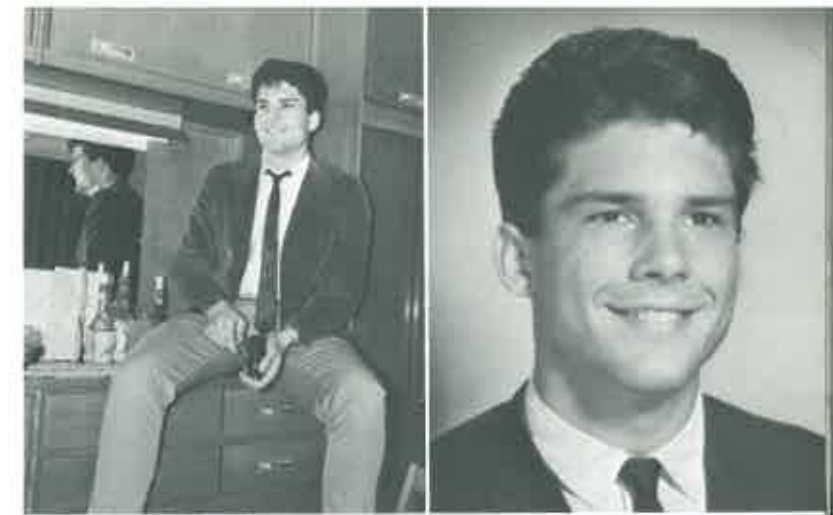

CAROLYNNE SUE BENN

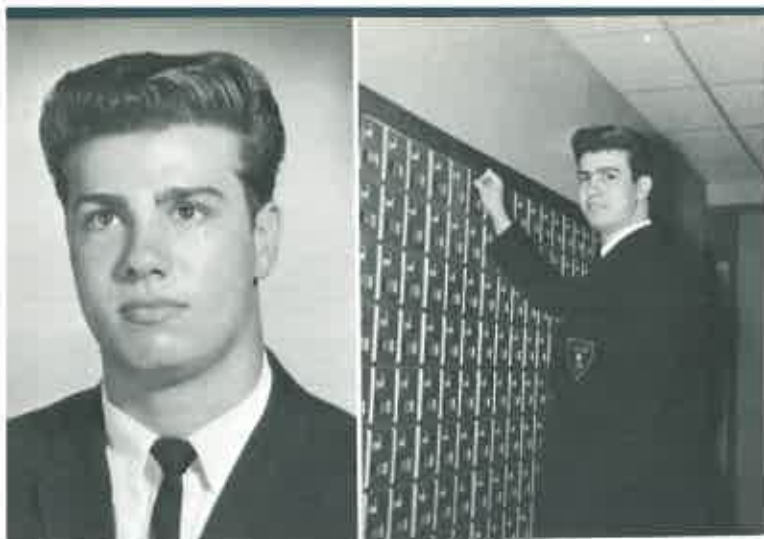
