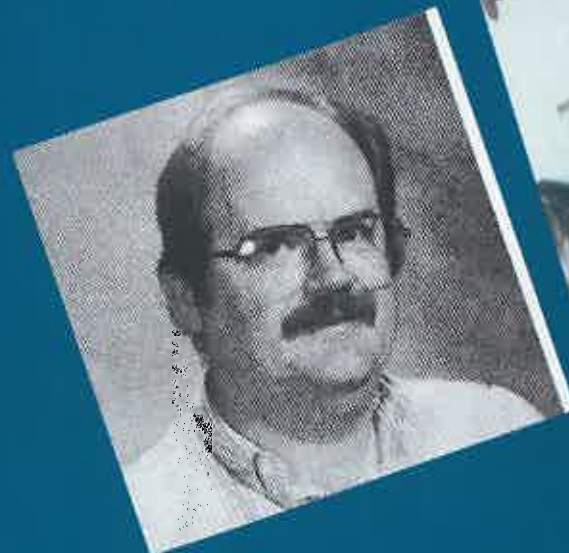

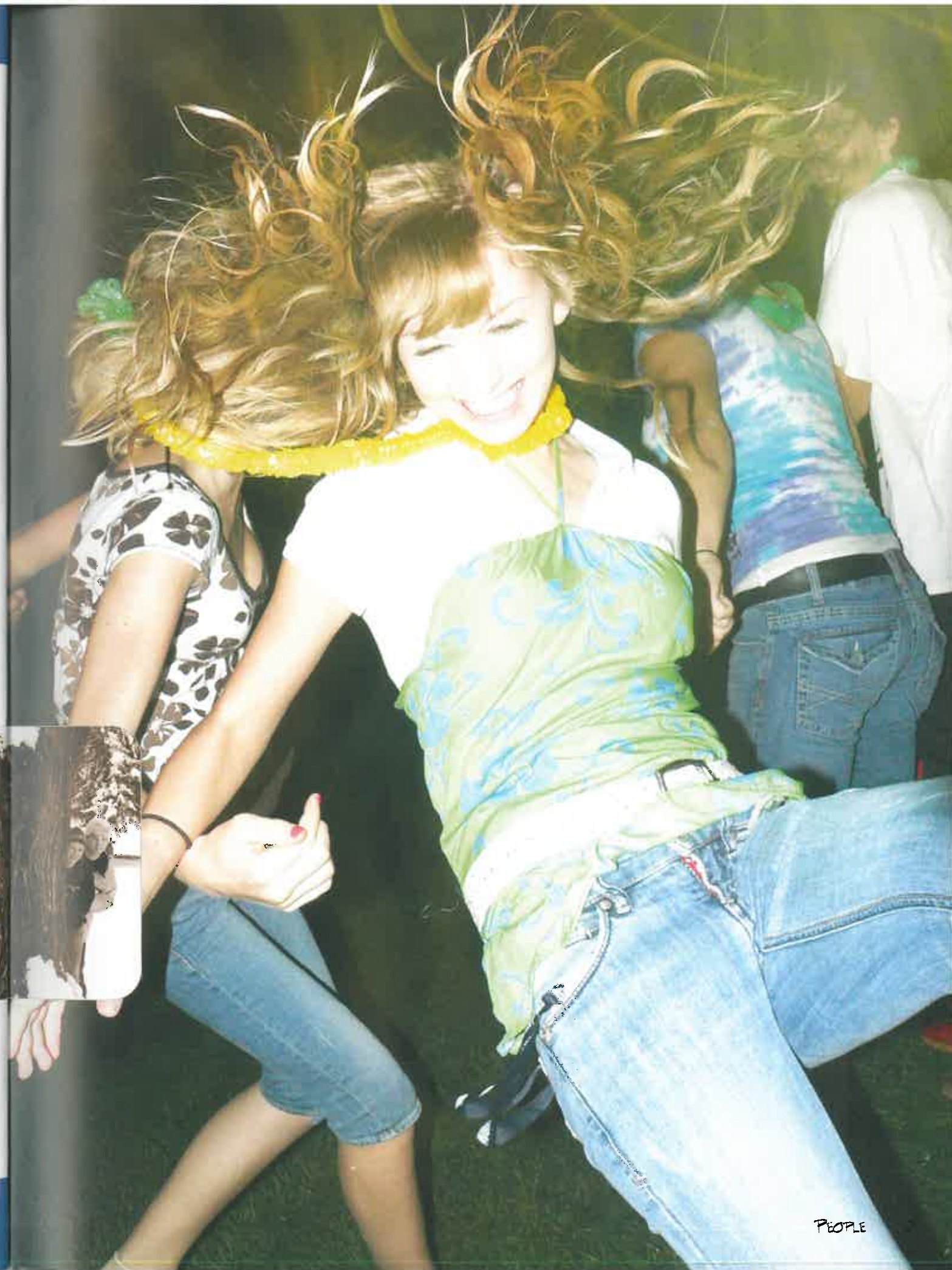

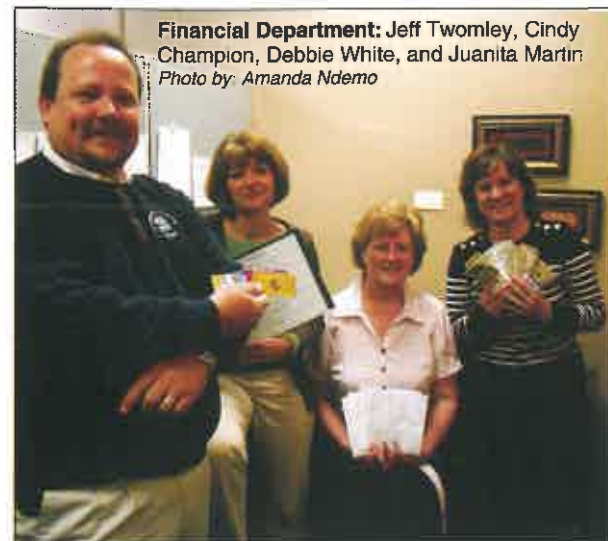
FREE TO BE... who we are!

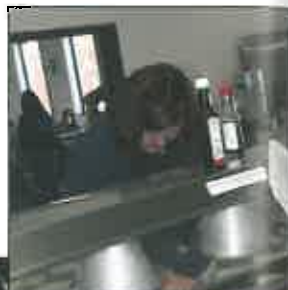

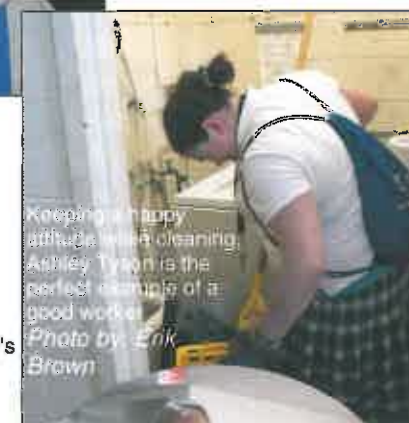

Senior Sanitizer



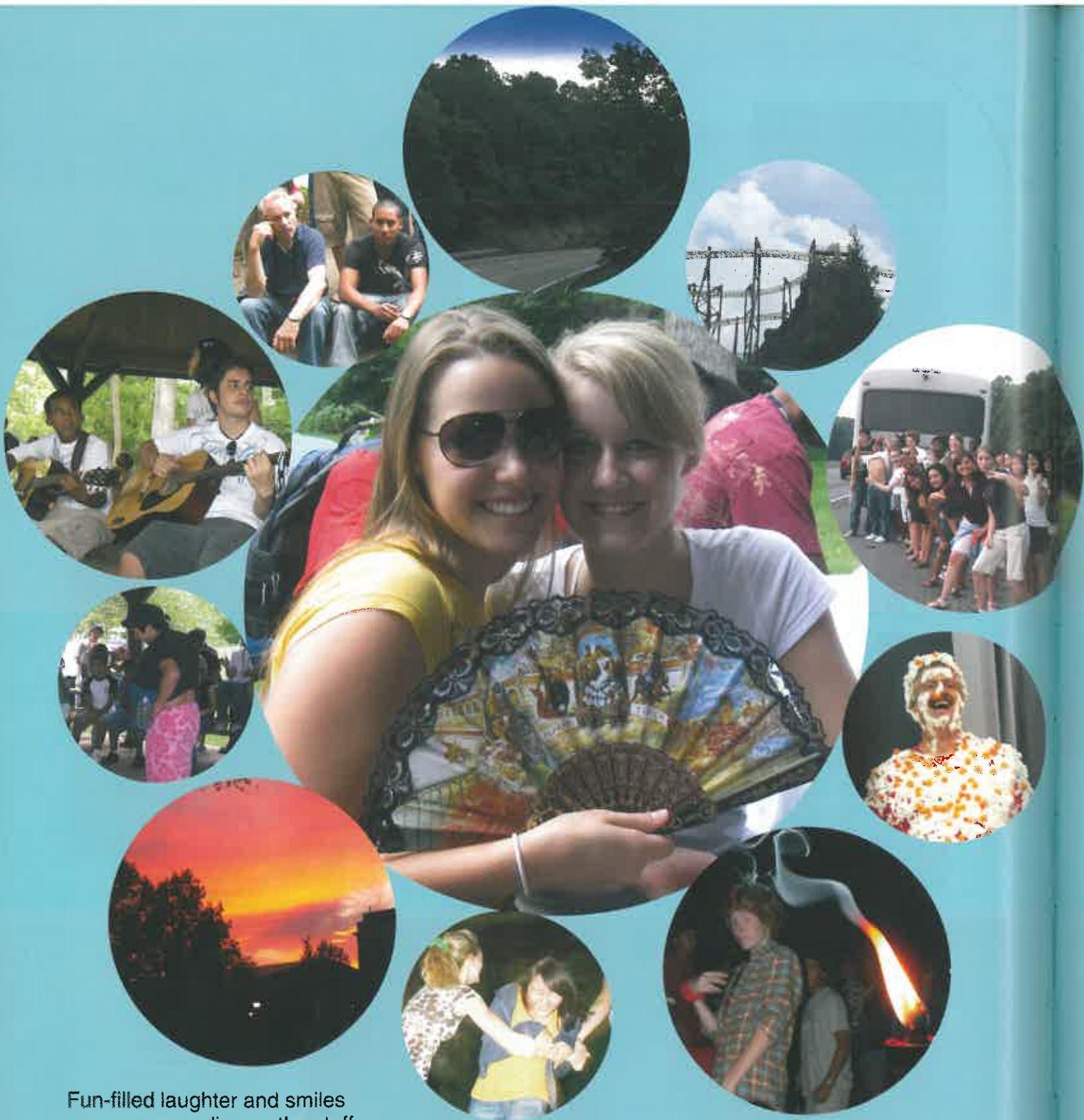

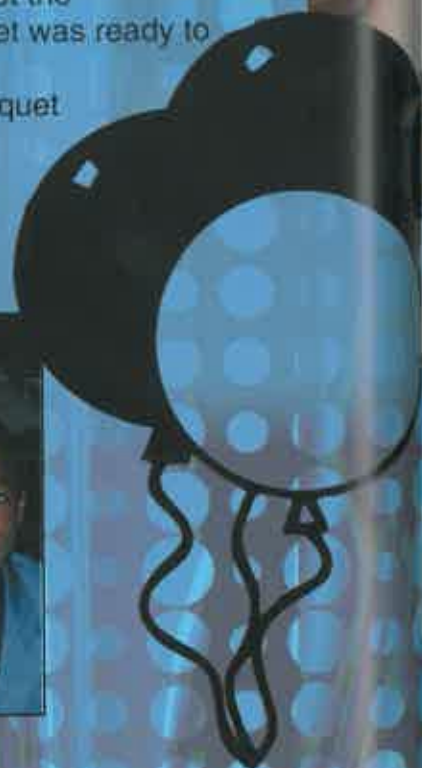

A Slice of Heaven...

Ciao Italia! Yahu Greece! What better way to spend spring break than in the mecca of Europe, Italy and Greece?

We wandered through the bustling streets of Florence, stopping by the Basilica di Santa Maria del Fior cathedral church (Duomo) and captivated by Vasari and Zuccaro's ornate fresco at the top of the dome. 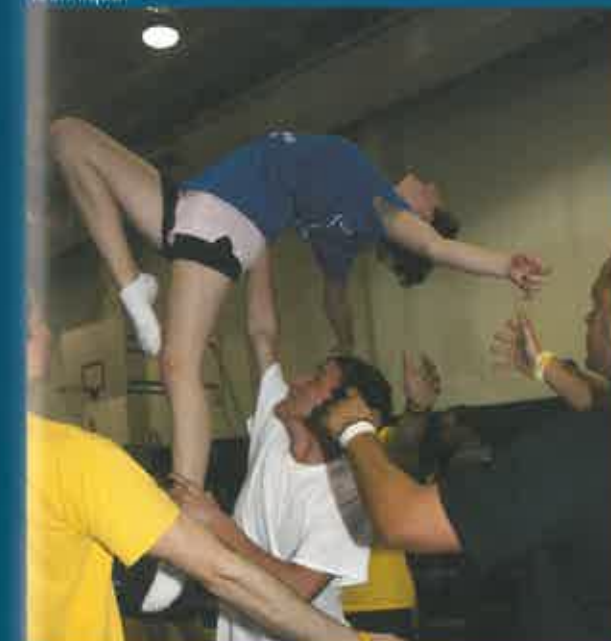

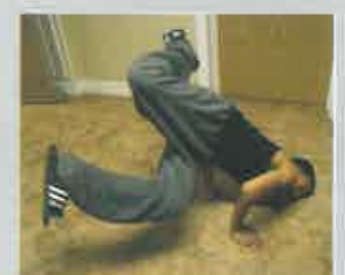
Yearbook Staff

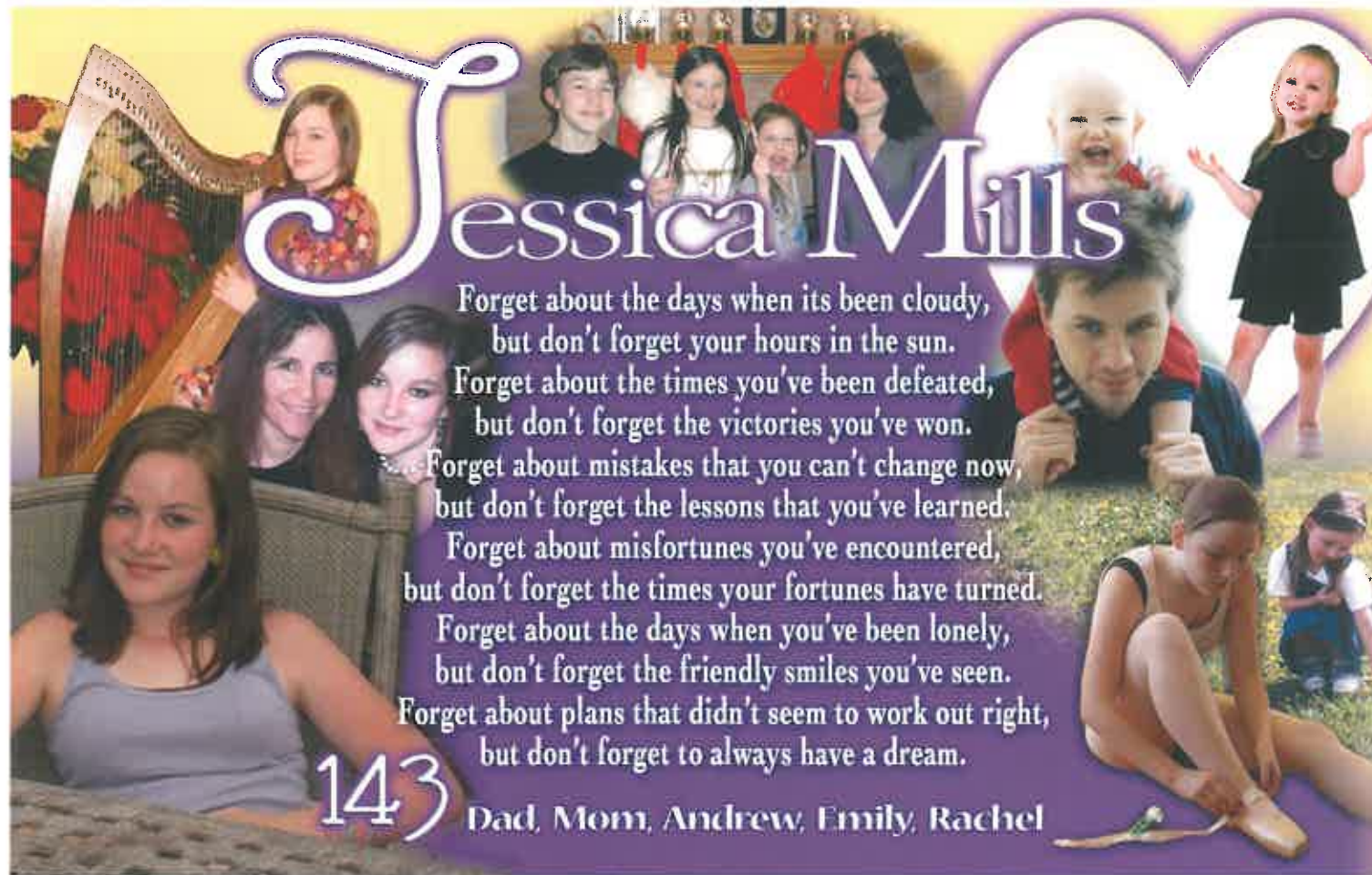
