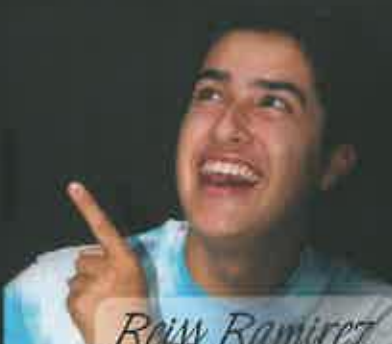

One truth that I know is that a close relationship with Christ will help pull you out of any canyon you're facing, and it will help change your attitude and perspective.

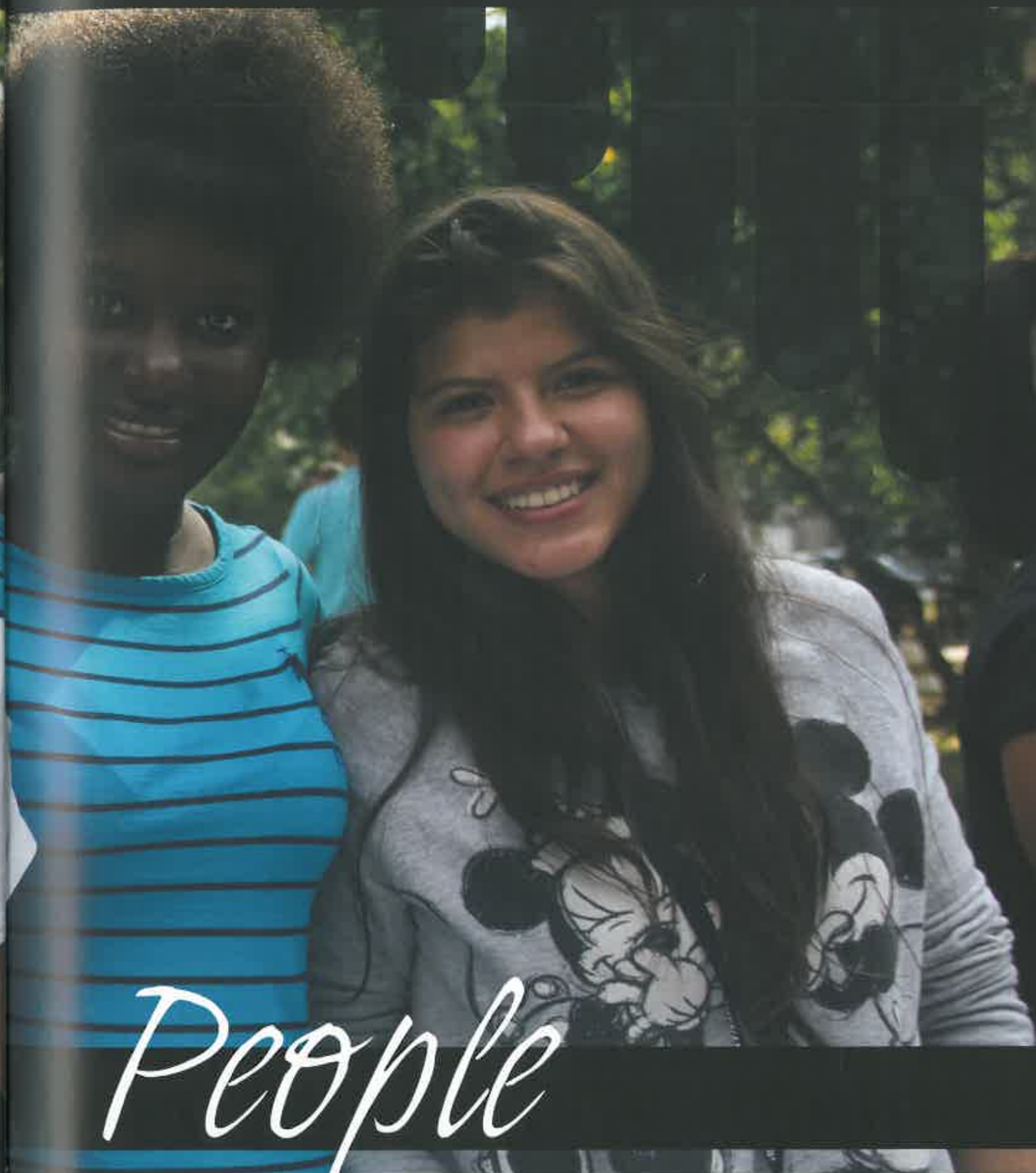

OUTDOOR EDUCATION

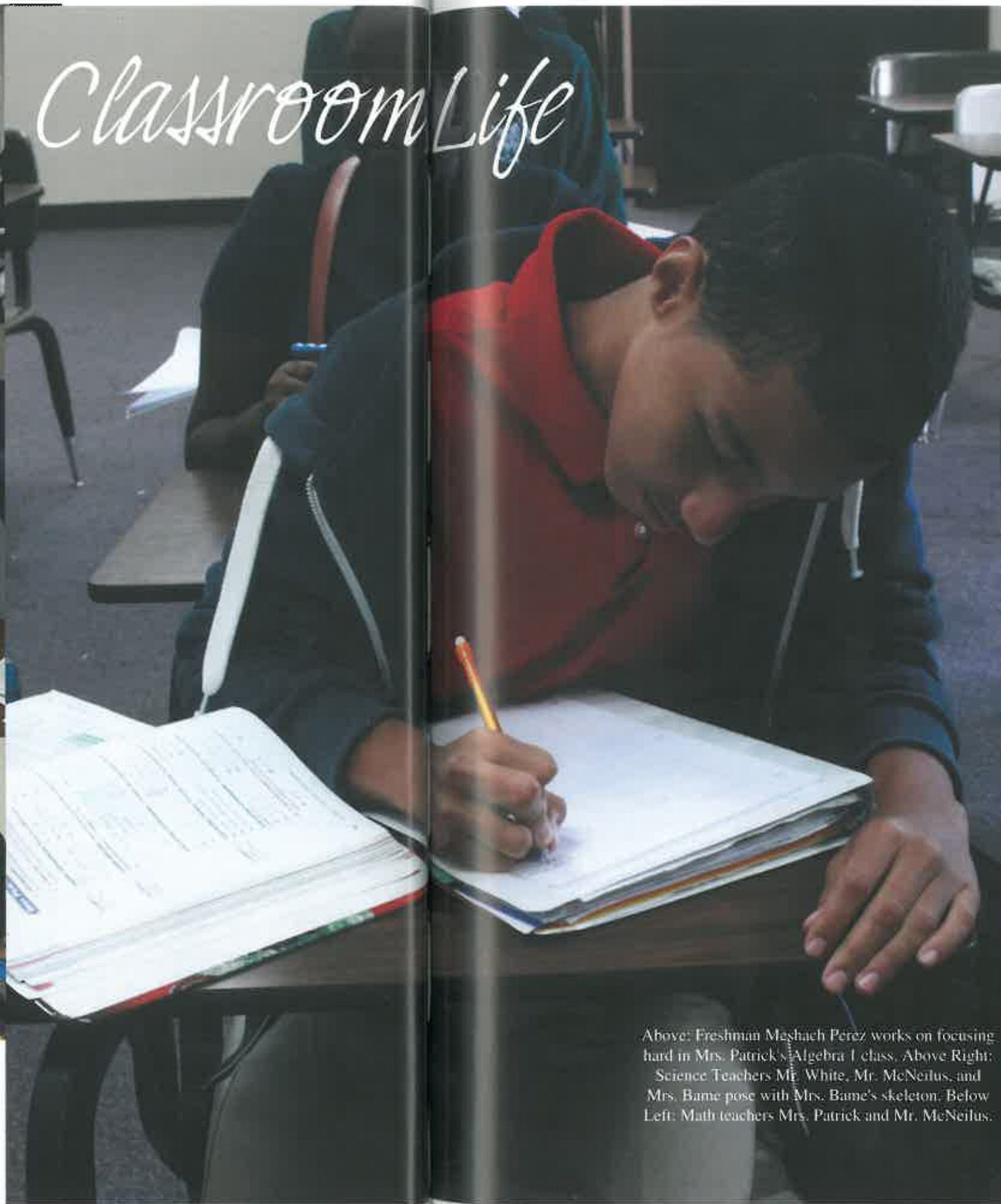

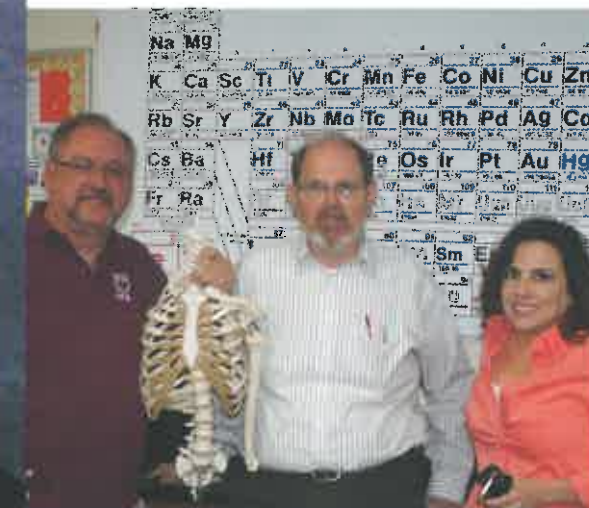

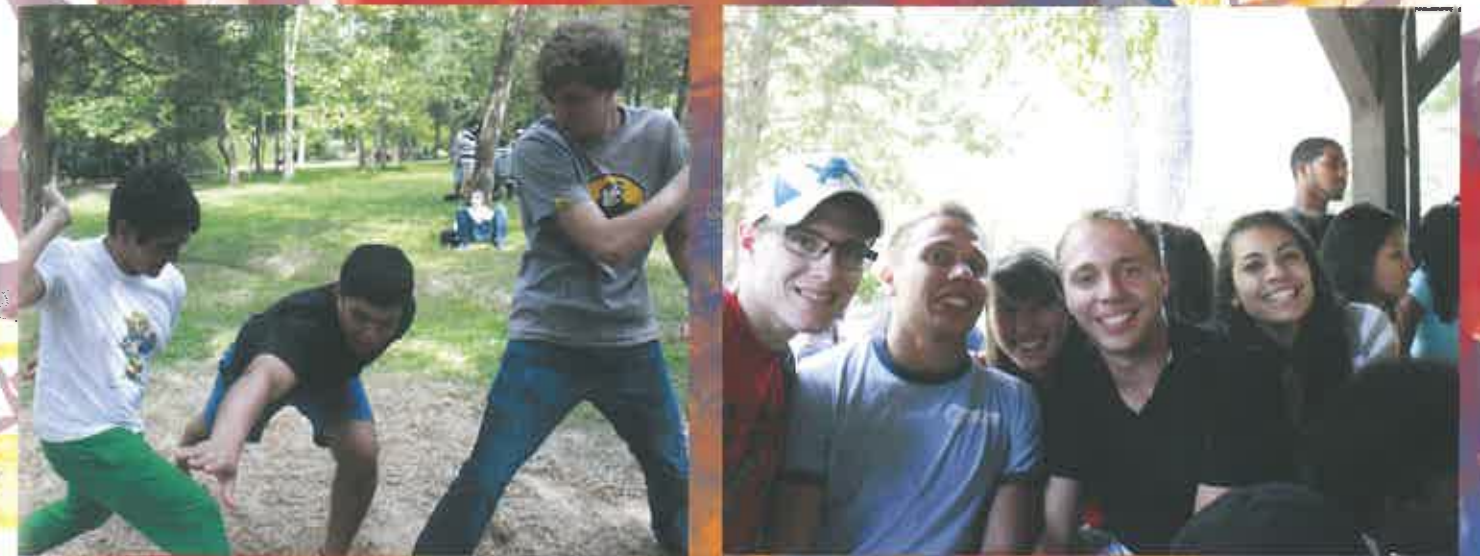

Amazonas, Brazil

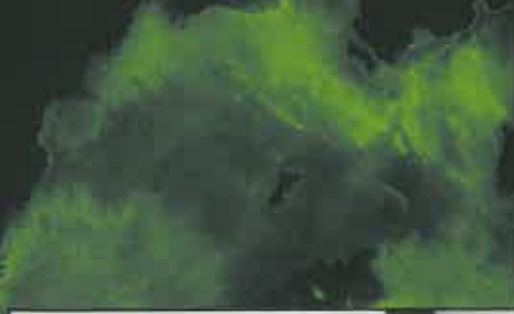

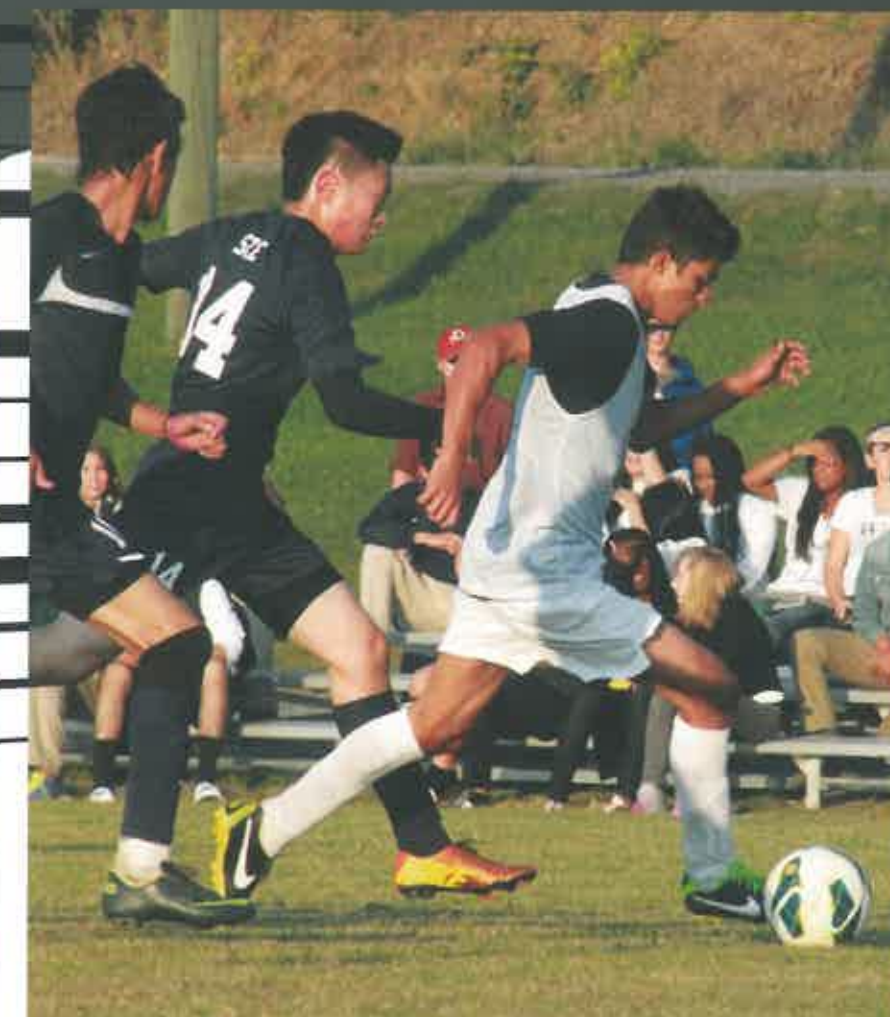

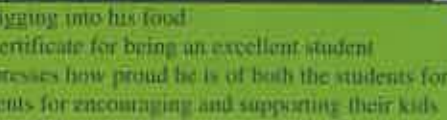

Christmas Pops Concert

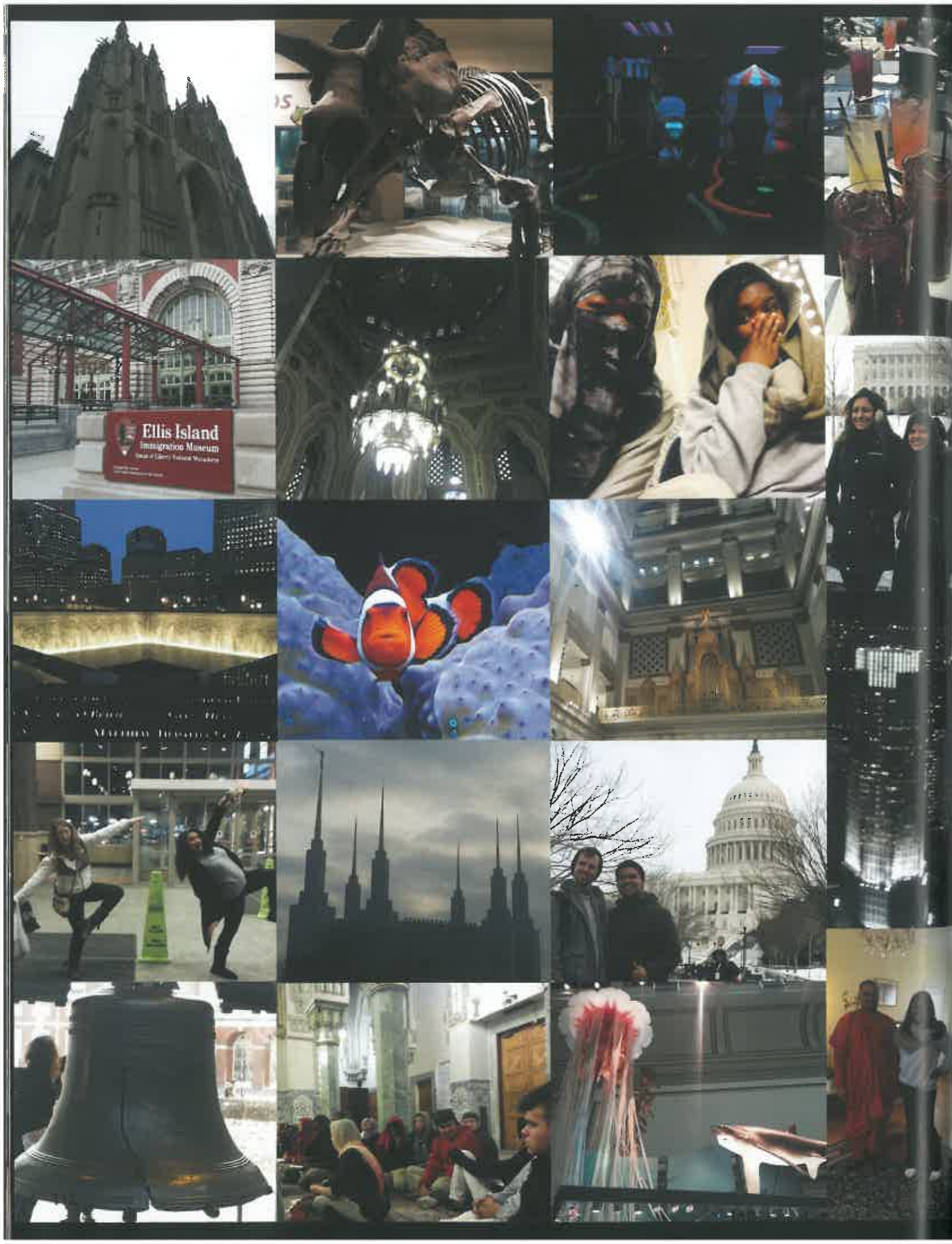

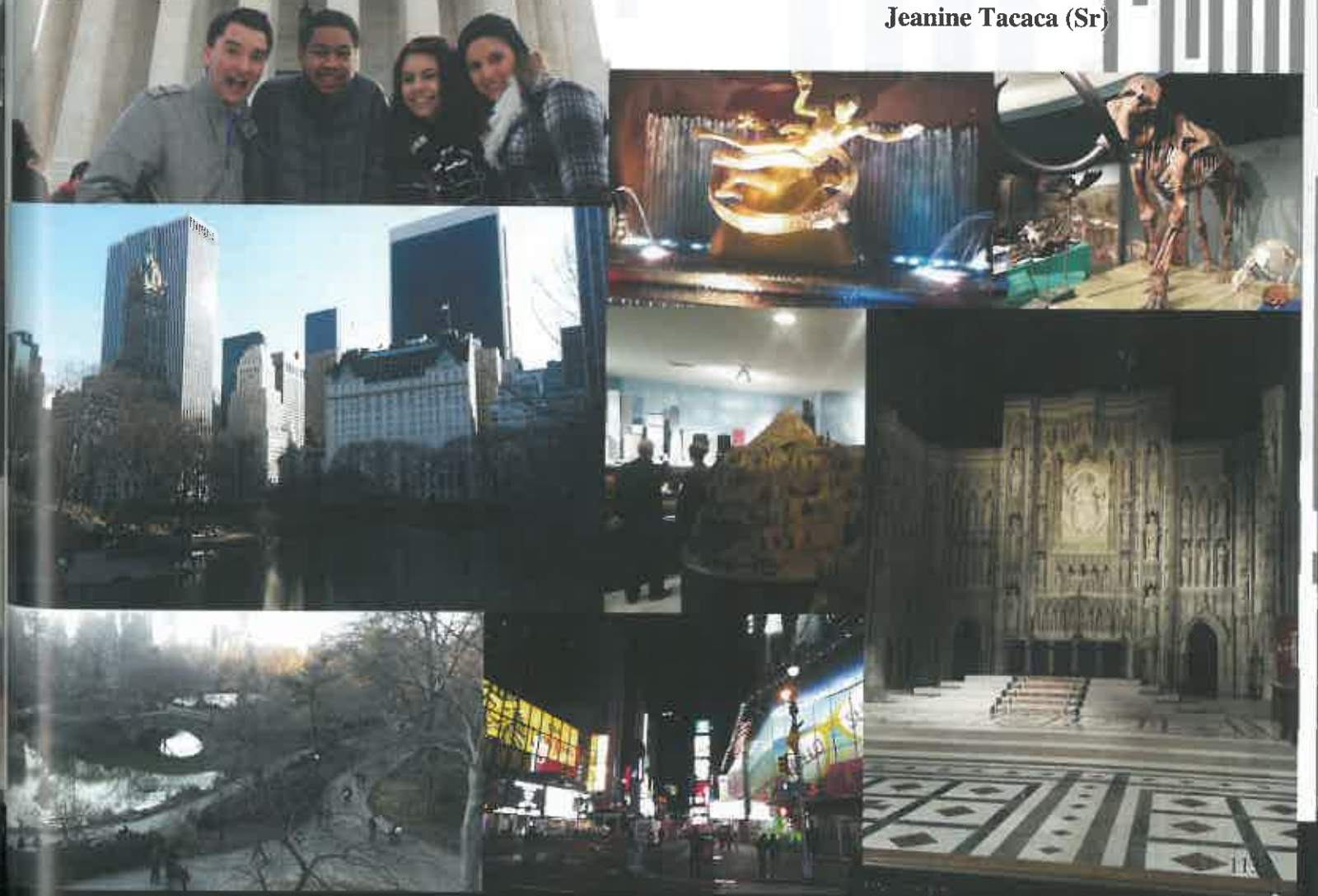

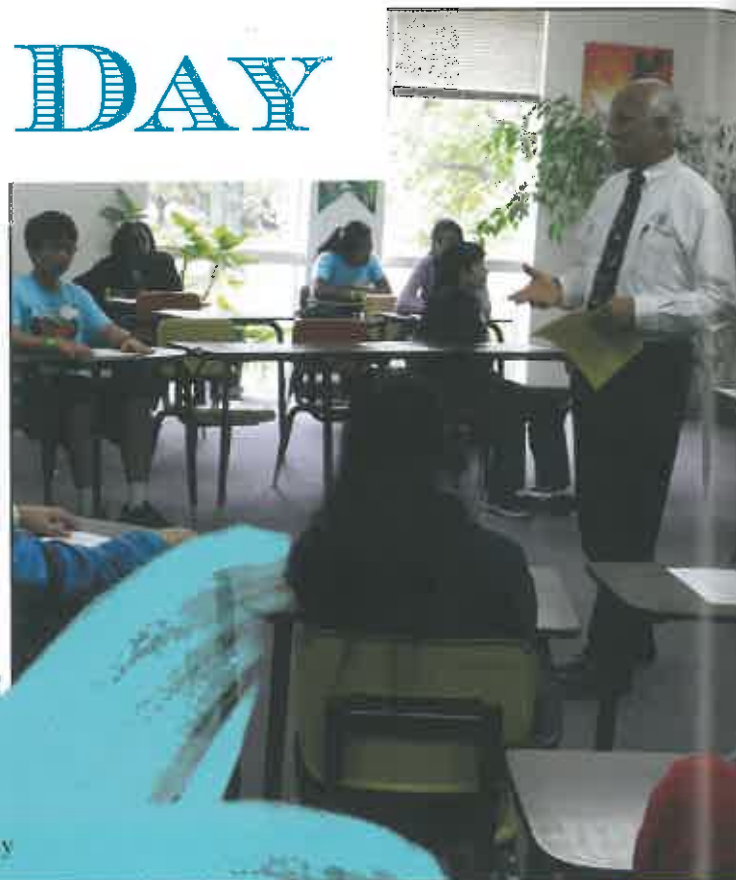

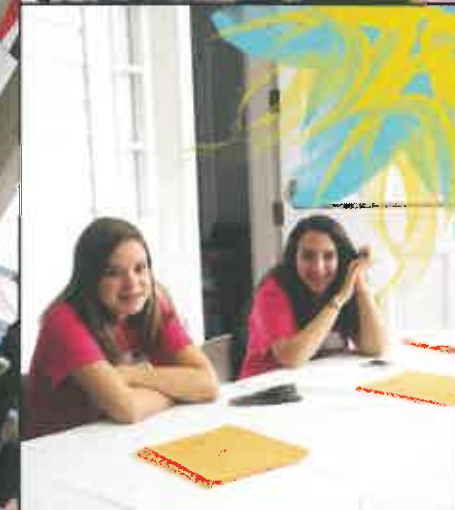
