








Nature Sabbath


"My favorite part about working on the farm is getting new projects like this one that we're doing right now." said Caleb Romero, a senior, as he put together a new metal table. Romero once helped pour a concrete slab in one of the greenhouses. He has worked with concrete in the past, so his knowledge came in handy for the job. "I've learned a lot of teamwork skills and problem-solving because I have worked on the farm." he added. "I love working on the farm and even asked if I could have this job."

Steve Paz, also a senior, enjoys working at Immanuel's Ground. Initially, he didn't think he would like to work in this environment. "When I first came here, I thought it was just planting and taking out weeds. But now I know it's more than that. For example, I never thought I'd be doing auto mechanics here, but I have gotten to work on the tractor before." Now, he, too, looks forward to going to work. "I've learned about a lot of random stuff, like building a table, making concrete, and time management." Paz also emphasized that he enjoys working outside, "where the air is fresh." "I would rather be outside than in an office-type situation." he said. "I would much rather work outside, get some sun, sweat a

little bit, and then go back to the dorm, shower, and relax."

The farm work program is part of SVA's vision for a holistic educational experience. "The farm is here because agriculture education is equally as valuable as music education and science education. That value is in the practical, experiential learning, and spiritual components," said Mr. Wiygul, the farm's manager. Mrs. Wiygul, the assistant farm manager, added that working on the farm can ultimately boost student wellness. "The key goal is to push the fulcrum for the kids' mental health. Bringing them out here to make flower arrangements, pick strawberries, and do these different tasks boosts their mental health. It boosts their spiritual health, too."


